The findings will advance our understanding of emotional regulation and problem-solving coping strategies for reducing the depressive symptoms of stroke caregivers, ultimately providing a culturally sensitive medical-social service direction for the delivery of community-based rehabilitation services to stroke families."

By fostering the psychological flexibility and prosociality of parents, we hope the mental health outcomes of parent-child dyads could be improved when facing the challenges arising from the pandemic ahead."

Cochrane Hong Kong > Updates

Cochrane Hong Kong and Cochrane US Network have been discussing with the Knowledge Translation Team of Cochrane Central Executive in taking the leadership and coordination of Cochrane Nursing Field forward. In addition, our Co-Director Prof. Janita Chau, who is also the Co-Chair of Cochrane China Network, convened the second Executive Committee meeting of the Network on 20 July 2021. The meeting focused on discussing how to promote evidence translation and dissemination, with various training workshops to be held in line with such plans. A new column was added to the <u>Cochrane China Network website</u> to disseminate the latest translated abstracts and plain language summaries of Cochrane Reviews.

Cochrane Hong Kong has been working on several Cochrane Review updates. Recently, we have started a review update on 'Multiple risk factor interventions for primary prevention of cardiovascular disease in low- and middle-income countries' from Cochrane Heart Group. Our author team comprised clinical, methodological and statistical experts from Hong Kong, Singapore and Taiwan. Considering that cardiovascular diseases are still the leading causes of mortality globally and more than 75% of the related deaths take place in low- and middle-income countries, we have decided to update this important review which was first published in 2015.



Cochrane Hong Kong also successfully organised two online pre-conference workshops entitled 'Interpreting Systematic Reviews and Using Cochrane Reviews' and 'Systematic Reviews and Evidence Synthesis' for the <u>7th Pan-Pacific</u> <u>Nursing Conference</u> on 26-27 May 2021, with the training team from Cochrane Singapore as speakers. More than 330 local and international healthcare professionals participated

in these two workshops, and around 250 of whom were staff nurses nominated and sponsored by the Hospital Authority, including a principal nursing officer, senior

managers, nurse consultants, advanced practice nurses and registered nurses from 43 local public hospitals.

We are also grateful to know that according to the 2020 Journal Citation Report, the impact factor of Cochrane Database of Systematic Reviews has been consistently increased from 7.89 in 2019 to 9.266 now.
