The mission of the Nethersole School of Nursing is to excel in research so that nursing knowledge can be generated to inform nursing practice. Research effort has been synergized through the development of the four research theme groups: cardiovascular and acute care, gerontology and long-term care, cancer and palliative care, and knowledge transfer.

In the past five years, the School has obtained external competitive research grants amounting to over HK\$108 million from various funding sources including Research Grants Council General Research Fund, Research Grants Council Public Policy Research Fund, Health and Health Services Research Fund, and Health Care and Promotion Fund. In addition, the School has an impressive publication record of more than 310 international refereed journal papers, 30 book chapters, and 330 invited and peer-reviewed conference papers.

Academic staff of the School have received various scholarly research awards from the Food and Health Bureau of Hong Kong Government, the Hospital Authority, and professional organizations in gerontology and oncology, which reflects the research excellence of the School and its significant contributions to improving the health of the community and advancing the development of nursing sciences.

Besides, academic staff of the School are frequently interviewed by the media to disseminate their research outputs and healthcare knowledge to



Gerontology and long-term care

The mission of the Gerontology and Long-term Care Group is to conduct research in aging which interconnects across the continuum of healthy aging, vulnerability and frailty. Its three major research priorities include i) supportive community care for older people, ii) innovations in chronic disease management and support to informal carers, and iii) enhanced nursing home care. The research work highlights the use of a multi-disciplinary framework that is sensitive to both gerontological and geriatric
